The Challenger division was established in 1989 as a separate division of Little League Baseball to enable boys and girls with physical and mental challenges to enjoy the game of baseball along with the millions of other children who participate in this sport worldwide.

Everyone gets a chance to play, regardless of limitations or ability. Each player gets a chance to bat. The side is retired when the offense has batted through. The Little League Challenger division is for ages 4-22 provided the player is still enrolled in a school program. This year, for the first time, Little League is offering a Senior Challenger Division, for players ages 15 and up. There is no age limitation for the Senior Challenger Division. Players who are ages 15-22 may register and play in either the Little League or Senior Challenger division.

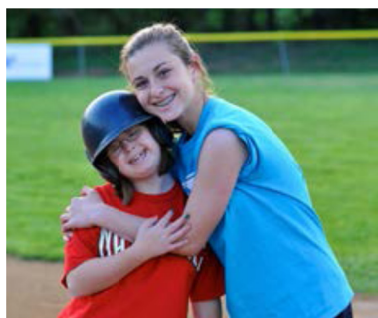
